Courses are year-long and run in 2 hour shifts. Articulation college credits are available for most courses. This means that a student who completes this program and continues on to DCTC as their post-secondary option will receive college credits at DCTC.</p>
College Level Examination Program (CLEP)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sociology • Communications 12 (College Composition CLEP exam) 	<p>College credits are determined by scores on CLEP exams and individual college CLEP credit policies. CLEP offers 33 different subjects in which a student can test and all of these are open to Simley students.
